IN RE: OPENING BUSINESS

Supervisor Hash made the motion to amend the agenda to include in board appointments Todd Cannaday from the EDA and adding resignation from Philip Vaughan from the Planning Commission and add under new business a Resolution for Grievance Procedure (Mr. Boyer noted this is for a USDA grant and this is an internal grievance procedure based on the Rehabilitation Act) which includes consent agenda items of regular meeting minutes of November 14, 2024; November bills & payroll; unanticipated revenue/budget amendments/transfer and personnel policy; duly seconded by Supervisor Cornett. Motion carried 5-0.

IN RE: PUBLIC HEARING(S)

A public hearing to receive public comments and consider input regarding the draft Comprehensive Plan in accordance with §15.2-2204 of the Code of Virginia. The Comprehensive Plan Amendments repeal & replace the adopted 2018 Comprehensive Plan in its entirety. Content, maps, goals, objectives, and strategies for all chapters have been revised and/or replaced entirely to address updated data and priorities identified through research and with the Code of Virginia. Updates to the Comprehensive Plan also

include adding the Grayson County Parks and Recreation Master Plan and a Comprehensive Plan Implementation Matrix. Mrs. Jada Black, Director of Planning & Zoning addressed the Board and noted the Planning Commission has completed its review and revisions of the Draft 2024 Comprehensive Plan (on file in Planning & Zoning Office), as required by Virginia state law Section 15.2-2230, which requires that a review be completed every five years to determine whether amendments are advisable – the Planning Commission worked on this draft for a little over a year to refine current data and update each chapter – the Planning Commission believes the revisions address the community’s needs and align with the vision for the county’s future development – this is a review/update, not a rewrite – Supervisor Ivey thanked the Planning Commission for all their hard work. Supervisor Hash made the motion to close public hearing; duly seconded by Supervisor Anderson. Motion carried 5-0. Supervisor Cornett made the motion to table the Comprehensive Plan to the following meeting; duly seconded by Supervisor Hash. Motion carried 5-0.

- Resolution – Adopting the Comprehensive Plan, Addendums, and Implementation Matrix – tabled to following meeting.

A public hearing to receive public comments regarding text amendment to the Grayson County Subdivision Ordinance concerning the regulation of Cemeteries as authorized by §15.2-2285 of the Code of Virginia. Supervisor Hash made the motion to open the public hearing; duly seconded by Supervisor Tomlinson. Motion carried 5-0. Mrs. Black noted the Planning Commission requests the Board’s consideration of amending the county subdivision ordinance to more comprehensively address the issue of family cemeteries – the subdivision ordinance doesn’t sufficiently address the development, preservation, and protection of family cemeteries that are often located on private properties – many families in our area have cemeteries on their land that have been passed down through generations, holding significant cultural, historical and emotional value – the Planning Department continues to receive calls from families wanting to establish family cemeteries – currently there is no guidance- this is for new cemeteries going forward (does not include post) – the Planning Commission has created language for consideration to exempt family cemeteries as a single division, additionally providing guidance for newly created family cemeteries to have a 30’ right of way from a state-maintained road, the cemetery is named and recorded in the clerk’s office for public record – Planning Commission held a public hearing on November 19<sup>th</sup>, unanimously passing a resolution for the Board’s consideration to amend the subdivision ordinance to allow for family cemeteries. Mrs. Black also noted that the Ordinance has been vetted by the County Attorney. Supervisor Hash made the motion to close the public hearing; duly seconded by Supervisor Tomlinson. Motion carried 5-0.

- Ordinance – To Amend Article 6, Section 6-3 of the Grayson County Subdivision Ordinance to Allow Family Cemeteries As A Permitted Single Division – Supervisor Hash made a motion to adopt the Ordinance (listed below) as presented by the Planning Commission; duly seconded by Supervisor Tomlinson.

**ORDINANCE**  
**OF THE COUNTY OF GRAYSON, VIRGINIA**  
**TO AMEND ARTICLE 6, SECTION 6-3 OF THE GRAYSON COUNTY**  
**SUBDIVISION ORDINANCE TO ALLOW FAMILY CEMETERIES**  
**AS A PERMITTED SINGLE DIVISION**

**WHEREAS**, Grayson County recognizes the need to preserve the ability for families to establish cemeteries on their property in accordance with cultural, historical, and personal preferences; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors of Grayson County believes it is necessary to amend the Grayson County Subdivision Ordinance to allow for family cemeteries as a specifically permissible division under the Single Division provisions; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Board of Supervisors of Grayson County, Virginia, after public notice, public hearing, and consideration of the best interests of the public, health, safety, and welfare, that the Subdivision Ordinance of Grayson County, Virginia, shall be amended by adding to Article 6, Section 6-3 of the Grayson County Subdivision Ordinance new Sections, numbered 6-3.1 and 6.3.2, as follows:

**Division for Cemetery Purposes:**

**6-3.1 Cemetery:** Land may be subdivided for a single division when set aside and dedicated solely for the development of a cemetery provided, and shall not be subject to lot size limitations, setbacks or similar requirements of this ordinance provided, however, that this property shall be served by a thirty (30) feet right-of-way from a state-maintained road. A cemetery shall be defined as a single division of property in which the land is used or intended to be used for the burial of the dead and dedicated for cemetery purposes, including columbariums, crematories, and mausoleums. A plat showing the cemetery boundary, right-of-way, and official name of the cemetery shall be submitted to the Subdivision Agent for review and approval.

Land divided for the purpose of establishing a separate parcel as a cemetery where the property has been used as a cemetery prior to March 13, 1978, shall not be required to follow the provisions of the ordinance provided; however, the plat showing the cemetery boundary shall be submitted to the Subdivision Agent for review and approval

**6-3.2 Definitions.** The following terms, as used in this section, shall be defined as indicated unless the context requires a different meaning:

**Cemetery:** Land dedicated for the burial and memorializing of deceased humans, including associated structures such as chapels and or mausoleums, art and statuary, and gardens. A cemetery may be a principal use or accessory to religious assembly uses. Cemeteries shall meet all requirements set forth in the Code of Virginia §57-26.

**Family Cemetery.** Means a private burying ground or cemetery, not operated for profit, that contains a collection of graves of people who descended from the same immediate family, and that is exempt from taxation pursuant to Article X, § 6 (a) (3) of the Constitution of Virginia.

**Immediate family member or descendant.** Means a spouse, child, parent, sibling, grandchild, grandparent, and parent-in-law of a deceased person buried in a family cemetery.

This ordinance shall be effective immediately. Should any section or provision of this ordinance be decided by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section or provision of this ordinance or of the Subdivision Ordinance of Grayson County.

**ORDINANCE**  
**OF THE COUNTY OF GRAYSON, VIRGINIA**  
**TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF GRAYSON COUNTY**  
**TO ADOPT REGULATIONS FOR CAMPGROUND(S) AND RV**  
**PARKS**

**WHEREAS**, section 15.2-2204 *et.seq.* of the Code of Virginia (1950, as amended) established that any locality may, by ordinance, establish regulations on zoning and planning; and

**WHEREAS**, the Grayson County Board of Supervisors have determined that it is in the best interest of public health, safety, and general welfare to amend and update regulations related to the establishment of campgrounds and RV parks; and

**WHEREAS**, the Grayson County Board of Supervisors have determined that the proposed amendments of the Grayson County Zoning Ordinance will establish standards for site development, occupancy, environmental considerations, and operational guidelines for campgrounds and RV parks, ensuring that they are compatible with surrounding land uses; and

**WHEREAS**, the Grayson County Planning Commission held a public hearing and recommended passage of this Ordinance on November 19, 2024; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Grayson, Virginia, held a public hearing on this Ordinance.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Supervisors of Grayson County, Virginia, after public notice, public hearing, and consideration of the best interests of the public health, safety, and welfare, that the Zoning Ordinance of Grayson County, Virginia, shall be amended, by adding new sections, 3-11.1 through 3-11.3, as follows:

**3-11.1** Regulation of Campground and RV Parks. The purpose of this section is to regulate the development of campgrounds and RV parks as provided and authorized in the Code of Virginia, § 15.2-2285.

**3-11.2** **Campground and RV Park Definition(s)**. The following terms, as used in this section, shall be defined as indicated unless the context requires a different meaning:

"Campgrounds" means tourist camps, travel trailer camps, recreation camps, family campgrounds, camping resorts, camping communities, or any other area, place, parcel, or tract of land, by whatever name called, on which three (3) or more campsites are occupied or intended for occupancy, or facilities are established or maintained, wholly or in part, for the accommodation of camping units for periods of overnight or longer, whether the use of the campsites or facilities is granted gratuitously, by a rental fee, by lease, by conditional sale, or by covenants, restrictions and easements. This definition is not intended to include migrant labor camps and summer camps as defined in §§ 32.1-203 and 35.1-16 of the Code of Virginia, construction camps, manufactured home parks, storage areas for unoccupied camping units, or property upon which the individual owner may choose to camp and not be prohibited or encumbered by covenants, restrictions and conditions from providing sanitary facilities within established property lines.

"Camping unit" means tents, tent trailers, travel trailers, camping trailers, pick-up campers, motor homes, yurts, cabins, or any other device or vehicular-type structure as may be developed marketed and used by the camping trade for use as temporary living quarters or shelter during periods of recreation, vacation, leisure time, or travel.

"Campsite" means any plot of ground within a campground used or intended for the exclusive occupation by a camping unit.

"Primitive campsites" means campsites that are characterized by the absence of toilets, showers, lavatories, electrical connections, or any combination thereof.

"Sanitary facilities" means toilets, privies, urinals, lavatories, and showers.

"Self-contained camping unit" means a unit that contains a toilet, and may contain a lavatory, shower, and kitchen sink, all of which are connected as an integral part of the structure to water storage and sewage holding tanks located within the unit.

"Service building" means a structure housing toilets, showers, or lavatories.

**3-11.3 Standards for Campgrounds and Recreational Vehicle Parks.** Campground and Recreational Vehicle Park developments should be designed to encourage compatibility of the area contained with surrounding land uses; ensuring that the public health, safety and general welfare are protected; minimizing adverse environmental impacts on the air, land and water resources of the state, and proper provisions for all public facilities shall be made. Developments shall conform to the following:

1. **Minimum Size for Campgrounds.** The area for the total campground/RV Park shall be no less than three (3) acres.
2. **Campsite Size.** Individual campsites shall be no less than three thousand (3,000) square feet. Each campsite shall be a minimum of fifty (50) feet in width and shall include parking spaces.
3. **Minimum Setback.**
  - a. Each campsite shall be set back a minimum distance of one hundred (100) feet from the adjoining properties. A lesser setback may be permitted if all adjoining properties agree to a lesser standard and shall be documented in a notarized document and recorded in the Clerk's Office of Grayson County.
  - b. Camping Units shall not be located within ten (10) feet of any campsite measured from the front, side and rear boundaries.
4. **Interior Roads and Primary Access.**
  - a. All interior roads shall have no less than thirty (30) feet right-of-way, established by deed or other recorded legal instrument, and shall be constructed with gravel or stone base to prevent erosion and sediment runoff.
  - b. Primary Access roads shall meet the Virginia Department of Transportation entrance requirements.

**5. Health and Safety Compliance.**

- a. All provisions for water and sewer disposal requirements shall be in accordance with the Virginia Department of Health Rules and Regulations Governing Campgrounds (12VAC 5-450 et al).
- b. All provisions for plumbing, electrical, mechanical and ADA accessibility shall comply with the provisions of the Uniform Statewide Building Code.
- c. Service Building. Campgrounds providing a service building shall meet the requirements of the Virginia Department of Health Rules and Regulations Governing Campgrounds (12VAC5-450-et.al). All service buildings will be constructed in accordance with the Virginia Uniform Statewide Building Code.

**6. Site Development Plan. Every application submitted to the Planning and Community Development Department for a special use permit for a campground shall contain the following:**

- a. Name, address, and telephone number of the applicant;
- b. Location, address and legal description of the entire proposed campground site;
- c. Existing zoning of subject property and all adjacent properties;
- d. Narrative addressing the management plan demonstrating how the proposed campground will be managed and how the impact on neighboring properties will be minimized. A copy of the proposed campground rules shall be included with the narrative, along with a copy of the proposed evacuation plan;
- e. Complete site plans and specifications prepared and stamped by a licensed VA architect, land surveyor, or engineer in a scale of the designer choice of the proposed campground showing:
  1. Boundary survey of the entire tract of land owned on which the proposed campground/RV Park to be located;
  2. If less than the whole tract will be used for campground/RV Park the site plan shall show proposed use of remaining land with the boundary of campground/RV shown;
  3. The land uses occupying the adjacent properties;
  4. The number, size, and location of the proposed campsites and parking areas;
  5. The location, public access, right of way, surfaced roadway, width and surfacing materials of the interior roads;
  6. The proposed interior vehicular and pedestrian patterns;
  7. The location of existing, or proposed structures, use intended for each structure, and location of open space areas, if any;
  8. The locations and details of lighting, electrical, and gas systems;
  9. Letter of review of proposed site access issued by the Virginia Department of Transportation.
  10. Letter of review of proposed campground and approval by the Virginia Department of Health
  11. Written acknowledgment of the need to comply with the permitting requirements from the Virginia Department of Health, Grayson County Building Official, and Grayson County Planning Department for Erosion and Sediment Control.
  12. Written acknowledgment of plan review feedback, and recommendations for safety by the Grayson County Sheriff's Department and Grayson County Emergency Management.

This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption. Should any section or provision of this ordinance be decided by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section or provision of this ordinance or of the Zoning Ordinance of Grayson County.

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Ridge Parkway is the most-visited unit of the national park system, attracting nearly seventeen million visitors each year and contributing significantly to the local and regional economies in Virginia and North Carolina; and

**WHEREAS**, the Parkway generates approximately \$1.4 billion in visitor spending and \$1.8 billion in total economic output for the 1,799,000 residents of the surrounding corridor of twenty-nine counties, seven independent Virginia cities, and numerous municipalities in North Carolina and Virginia, including the towns of Buchanan, Fincastle, and Troutville in Botetourt County; and

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Ridge Parkway Foundation serves as the sole official philanthropic partner to the Blue Ridge Parkway, advocating for necessary funding and resources for the Parkway’s maintenance, preservation, and community engagement; and

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Ridge Rising strategic plan provides a roadmap for the sustainable management and enhancement of the Parkway, ensuring that it continues to serve as a vital resource for environmental education, recreation, tourism, and community connection; and

**WHEREAS**, Tropical Storm Helene has caused catastrophic damage and loss of life for several communities in western North Carolina and southwest Virginia, including those communities adjacent to the Parkway; and

**WHEREAS**, repairs are critical to preserving the safety and accessibility of the Parkway and its adjacent communities, which is essential for their economic wellbeing; and

**WHEREAS**, collaboration among local, state, and federal governments is critical in this response and imperative to secure the necessary funding and policies that will sustain and benefit the communities surrounding the Blue Ridge Parkway; and

**WHEREAS**, the establishment of a coalition composed of elected officials and community representatives will enhance advocacy efforts and foster a unified regional voice for the Blue Ridge Parkway corridor.

- Resolution – Adopting an Internal Grievance Procedure Implementing Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973

**RESOLUTION  
THE GRAYSON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
ADOPTING AN INTERNAL GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE IMPLEMENTING  
SECTION 504 OF THE REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973**

**WHEREAS**, the Grayson County Board of Supervisors has adopted an internal grievance procedure providing for prompt and equitable resolution of complaints alleging any action prohibited by the Department of Housing and Urban Development’s (HUD) (24 CFR 8.53(b) implementing Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 USC 794). Section 504 states, in part, that (no otherwise qualified handicapped individual ... shall solely by reason of his handicap, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance ...”

**WHEREAS**, complaints should be addressed to the Grayson County Director of Human Resources, who has been designated to coordinate Section 504 compliance efforts.

1. A complaint should be filed in writing or verbally contain the name and address of the person filing it, and briefly describe the alleged violation of the regulations.
2. A complaint should be filed withing *ten (10) days* after the complainant becomes aware of the alleged violation. (Processing of allegations of discrimination occurring before this grievance procedure was in place will be considered on a case-by-case basis).
3. An investigation, as may be appropriate, shall follow a filing of a complaint. The investigation will be conducted by the Director of Human Resources. These rules contemplate informal but thorough investigations, affording all interested persons and their representatives, if any, an opportunity to submit evidence relevant to a complaint. Under 24 CFR 8.53(b), the Human Resources Department need not process complaints from applicants for employment or from applicants for admission to housing.
4. A written determination as to the validity of the complaint and description of resolution, if any, shall be issued by the Director of Human Resources and a copy forwarded to the complainant no later than *thirty (30) days* after its filing.

5. The Section 504 coordinator shall maintain the files and records of the complainant relating to the complaints filed.
6. The complainant can request a reconsideration of the case in instances where he or she is dissatisfied with the resolution. The request for reconsideration should be made within *ten (10) days* to the County Administrator.
7. The right of a person to a prompt and equitable resolution of the complaint filed hereunder shall not be impaired by the person's pursuit of other remedies such as the filing of Section 504 complaint with the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Utilization of this grievance procedure is not a prerequisite to the pursuit of other remedies.
8. These rules shall be construed to protect the substantive rights of interested persons, to meet appropriate due process standards and to assure that the County complies with Section 504 and the HUD regulations.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Grayson County, Virginia Board of Supervisors does hereby adopt this grievance procedure.

Mr. Boyer noted that discussions regarding the convenience center has taken place over the past six (6) months – public works department is running in a deficit and the convenience center costs approximately \$55,000/year – the Town of Independence has made the decision to no longer use Grayson County Public Works and effective January 2025 they will be using GFL which is a loss of approximately \$79,000 – not sure if town residents will sign up for GFL or use the convenience center – if they use the convenience center, we don't know what the increase to the county will be. Supervisor Hash made the motion to do away with the convenience center effective January 1, 2025; duly seconded by Supervisor Tomlinson. Discussion among the Board took place

which included: monitor center; increase number of bags (would require an ordinance change); increase in operation cost to place convenience centers in different areas; service used by Independence area, not entire county; owe citizens to cut cost; potentially increase number of bags to make more equal to entire county; dumpsters in each district; need to think about long term and in favor of looking at other options. After discussion, the motion passed 5-0.

- Mr. Werth met with our EDA and has verbally received the go ahead to establish a site and pharmacy in Independence; closing the EC telehealth office due to lack of usage
